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- INTRODUCTION -

The Escuela Museo Origami Zaragoza (EMOZ) opened its doors in December 2013, located on the 2nd floor of the Centro de Historias de Zaragoza, located in Plaza de San Agustín, 2.

The non-profit association Origami Zaragoza is responsible for the management of EMOZ, and ensures the fulfillment of its objectives.

one of its main tasks is the exhibition, making traveling exhibitions throughout the national territory, with the possibility of creating exhibitions on demand of the applicant. As well as the work of dissemination through workshops aimed at schools and the general public in all its forms (face-to-face and on-line).


The EMOZ currently has a valuable collection of original models (folded by the same authors who conceived them, all of them at the forefront of the international scene). Because humidity, temperature and lighting conditions affect the raw material of the exhibits, we take the precaution of limiting exhibitions to a maximum of three months. In this way, all models are sheltered for most of the year.

In many cases, the exhibiting authors cede part of their exhibited work, for a limited or even indefinite period of time, to the museum's collection, thus increasing the quantity and value of the collection

Many of the exhibitions are held outside the EMOZ headquarters. Thus, many institutions such as municipalities, banks, civic centers, libraries, etc. contact the EMOZ management to request an exhibition, either generic or with a specific theme (for example, in the Tower of Abizanda (Huesca) models related to fantastic beings and witchcraft were exhibited).

The dissemination work is mainly focused on workshops that, during the week, are aimed at school groups and on weekends at the general public.

Currently, an activity aimed at primary and secondary school teachers is being prepared, intertwining origami with teaching activities.



- EXHIBITIONS IN EMOZ-


The EMOZ has seven exhibition halls plus a previous room that presents the history of paper and the evolution of origami through a timeline.

To date, there are already 29 temporary exhibitions that endorse us, making our museum -unique in the world- a world reference in this artistic discipline. EMOZ takes advantage of the variety of works and artists invited to exhibit, seeing it as an opportunity to change all its content and thus make a living, dynamic and constantly evolving and updating museum.

The following is a small sample of the exhibitions organized in the EMOZ space in the temporary period from 2013 to 2021.





-TRAVELING EXHIBITIONS-

Thanks to our extensive and varied collection of figures, EMOZ is open to a horizon of possibilities when programming possible origami exhibitions in different national locations and also in other countries.

The EMOZ promotes this type of exhibitions that can be generic (with a selection of exclusive models and all the interpretative techniques) or can be adjusted to a specific theme, such as dinosaurs, mathematics, fantastic beings, women in origami, etc.



Éric Joisel



One of the top personalities in the world of origami and the person who elevated Origami to an art form is our master Éric Joisel, the youngest of five brothers, born in Paris on November 15, 1956. Éric spent a few years studying law and commerce.

At the same time, from an early age (17 years old), he began his training as a sculptor in stone, clay and wood. Then he worked in a printing workshop. And, on occasion, as a clown when he needed money.

His interest in Origami developed in the 1980s, after seeing a photograph of one of the famous self-portraits of Akira Yoshizawa (1911-2005). In 1983. Éric Joisel met the artist Usatarô Kimura. who introduced him to a Japanese bookstore in Paris where he was able to buy books by Yoshizawa and other origami artists. He quickly began to create his first models. His and Kimura's creations were exhibited for the first time in 1987 at the Espace Japan during the exhibition "House of Paper Beasts."

For the next five years, Eric organized numerous origami exhibitions in France. In 1992, he decided to devote himself to Origami full time. The following year, he started working with Michel Charbonnier for the French Origami Society.



Although his work was virtually unknown abroad, he came into contact with other artists during one of the meetings of the French Paper Folding Movement in Troyes in 1996. That same year he exhibited at the Origami Festival in southeast Charlotte, North Carolina.

In 1997 he finally met the man who had inspired him, Akira Yoshizawa, at a British Origami Society convention in York. Éric exhibited several designs that impressed the participants and, from then on, he established many contacts in England, which were essential for the rest of his career.

In 1998, he was the director of Paris Origami, a large exhibition at the Carrousel du Louvre. He was invited in October 1999 to Akira Yoshizawa's beiju (the celebration of his 88th birthday) in Tokyo, only five origami artists were able to present their works alongside those of the master. Éric was one of them

Joisel became a sought-after guest at many Origami conven-







tions around the world. He defined himself as "a little crazy French clown" and "a little suburban folder".

On his return from a convention in Israel in 2008, he was diagnosed with lung cancer. Despite this, he participated in Vanessa Gould's documentary "Between the folds" ("Between the folds", Green Fuse Films, 2008).

He continued to participate in conventions and exhibitions (Verbania, Lago Maggiore, in December 2008; Lyon, in November 2009) and personally drove a rented car from Paris to Zaragoza, a few months before his death.

Even at times when his treatment weakened him the most, Éric continued to work on his masterpiece, a major project: the series of the characters of the Commedia dell'arte.

With much difficulty already, he provides material for the book "Éric Joisel, The Origami Magician", a detailed anthology of his work published by Origami House in Tokyo.Finally, Éric Joisel died at the Argenteuil Hospital in Paris on October 10, 2010, surrounded by his family and closest friends, aged only 53.



All this makes Éric Joisel so important in today's world of Orgami, and thousands of people try to discover his folding method impossible to imitate because as he said "my origami is 30% folding and 70% modeling"... thus building beautiful paper sculptures.

The museum has a large collection of models that delight visitors every time they are exhibited.


These are the titles of the traveling exhibitions that we have taken to several cities with a sample of figures that represent all the folding techniques that exist within the classification that was made for our permanent collection of models.

In these exhibitions there is a tour both temporal and technical that lead the viewer to cover all existing forms of Origami, from traditional folding to the most hyper-realistic, from the pure lines of a bow tie to the most complex dragons, from the curved lines of sculptural folding to the thousands of folds of an organic folding.

A walk through origami is the purpose of this exhibition, that the visitor leaves it knowing all the works of art that can be made with a single sheet of paper, of course without cutting or gluing.

It highlights the geometric character of the figures exhibited, but also the importance of mathematics in the design of figures or how the combination of both disciplines has been used, for example, to fold and unfold the solar panels of space satellites or to solve classical problems.

Another highlights the importance of tessellations: figures in which the same motif is repeated numerous times covering the space and generally have hundreds of folds. The study of the scars that appear on a sheet of paper after unfolding a figure, and their importance when designing new models, is the theme of another room.

There is also a place for proper names, as far as mathematical origami is concerned.









Paper women

Women of Paper is an exhibition of original works of art that brings together the work of 73 artists from 21 countries. It includes more than 250 contemporary Origami creations with a wide spectrum of styles and techniques. This exhibition aims to be a tribute to femininity, we will explore the presence of women in the world of Origami; firstly, as active and creative people, and also as a subject of representation.





The idea for the exhibition was born in 2015, in Barcelona, during a conversation between Alessandra Lamio, Daniela Carboni and Felipe Moreno, curator of EMOZ, planning future exhibitions of the museum. Together they thought it might be interesting to explore the presence of women in the world of Origami by collecting models created by female authors

from all over the world, and using very different techniques and styles. They noted that it was also important to complete this tribute to femininity with a collection of models representing the female body, a fascinating subject but difficult to carry out with Origami techniques, which have always tested the ability of authors and authors.



Each room will be dedicated to a different type of Origami (representative, geometric, modular, etc.) There will also be a room dedicated to the representation of the female body through Origami.

Paper Dinosaurs


One of the most coveted themes for many Origami model makers is the world of dinosaurs, in the museum we have a large collection of Jurassic models, this collection is very requested especially by the young public.





In a privileged place on the coast of the Principality, 155 meters above sea level, stands the Jurassic Museum of Asturias (MUJA), a unique museum that, in the form of a large tridactyl dinosaur footprint, houses one of the most complete and educational exhibitions in the world about these fascinating reptiles.

In this emblematic place we made an exhibition of more than 80 dinosaurs, during 6 months, with a great repercussion by the students of many schools in Asturias, who went to visit both the exhibition and the workshops that the museum proposed as an activity.

A multidisciplinary collective born in 2000, the CRIMP develops original techniques of advanced folding and structured crumpling applied to the development of bio-inspired evolutionary models.



The team associates artistic talents and scientific expertise which are expressed on the occasion of exhibitions, installations, seminars, events, trainings... For several years, the artistic installations realized by the CRIMP have multiplied in France and abroad. Real technical results in terms of the quantity of paper used, these immersive works develop a fantastic and sensitive universe.

The paper sculptures ignore our senses, flirting between the micro and the macro cosmos, in relation to an increasingly numerous public. The CRIMP installations, each time, proved their power of attraction, with marks of frequentation in the places where they are hosted.

The creator of this new way of looking at Origami is Vincent Floderer.







Born in Brive, France in 1961. He began folding seriously at the beginning of his studies at the School of Fine Arts in Paris in 1981, he knew that Origami had been developed in Japan and was particularly interested in moving and three-dimensional models.

"I still have a vivid memory of the first time I folded the flapping bird and the fascination it produced in me. I was at that time engaged in the study of drawing and sculpture and the approaches between these disciplines seemed obvious to me: the modeling of the earth and the folding, for example ... I began then to imagine new ways to take advantage of the sculpture using this material so ... plastic that is paper, using folds and only folds".

The practice of origami, in this way, has given him many occasions to present his work in very different and sometimes unexpected places around the world.

Universality is also an important dimension of this art form, inseparable from its interdisciplinary practice, capable of creating bridges between art and science in all fields.

Since 1997, he learned to crumple paper as a result of a workshop held a few years ago by Paul Jackson.

As a result of a "Mushroom", the possibilities of this technique have appeared so expanded that the work of a single life would not have been enough to explore them. The shapes and structures obtained are in line with those of the natural world, with no intention of copying. Simplicity is not simplicity.

The research conducted by the CRIMP team is part of this dynamic of evolution and constant renewal for change.

- AWARDS AND RECOGNITIONS-

The EMOZ, since its inception, has always been related to the Royal House and the Japanese Embassy, entities that have always supported the dissemination of culture.

The Royal Family has participated by chairing the Honorary Committees of the museum's most important events.


The Japanese Embassy awarded the museum the Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs Award for the dissemination of Japanese culture in Spain.

The museum has also collaborated with Correos in the development of the first stamp that can be sent folded, building the traditional figure of the Pajarita.
